

Household

In this section, we ask about your household. This includes questions about your parents or guardians, emergency contacts, and residency status. Schools may use this information when evaluating your application.

Contact information for who schools should reach out to in an emergency
- 3 • Texas residency**
Questions related to where you live and you or your parent/guardian's tax information

Questions about immediate family (if applicable)




Double check your application was submitted
